Early Corvette Exhaust Extensions

A special feature of the first edition Corvettes, 1953-55, were the exhaust extensions. What made the extensions necessary was that the exhaust exited through the body, not through a bumper or directly to the ground.

There were eventually two styles of extensions, however both styles were attached the same way. The back of the extension slides over the exhaust pipe with an insulator assembly (Fig. 1) that has four adjustable brass clips to hold the tip tight.

At the body a clamp (Fig.2) was used to secure and align the extension in place.

The first style, used on all '53s and to VIN # 2628 in '54, was a short extension (Fig. 3) that extended past the body by no more than 1 1/2".

This created a problem with the messy exhaust fumes staining the body paint. These early 235ci motors were not exactly environmentally "clean". The engineers came up with a unique solution. The second design (Fig. 4) long extension increased the distance the tip would extend past the body to 4 1/2". The clever part is that the exhaust would then be directed downward not out the end. This was accomplished by using a deflector inside the extension. In theory, this would allow the air flow from under the car to remove the exhaust away from the rear of the car limiting the staining.





From what I've observed it works well and looks cool. A very nice and unique part.



The location for Chapter meetings is at St. Peter's Episcopal Church located at 6013 Lawton Avenue, Oakland, CA 94618.


