Dip Painting for an Authentic GM Look By Gary Beaupre

If you've ever had the chance to closely examine production line, C2 brackets of various kinds that were painted chassis black (such as bumper, sway bar, steering shock brackets, etc.), you've probably noticed that there often are runs, drips, puddles and blisters in the dried paint. In the first two photos I show two GM sway bar brackets; one with a paint blister that popped after drying; the other with a run/puddle, adjacent to another area that received little to no paint. If instead, you purchase reproduction brackets from the reproduction parts companies, you'll find that the paint on the repro parts typically has no flaws whatsoever. You'll certainly find no reproduction part that has the major sort of paint blemishes seen on some GM production parts. The repro parts look way too nice in terms of the paint. Some repro parts appear to have been powder-coated or E-coated.

The reason that some GM parts have paint blemishes is because of the way they were painted. On the Technical Discussion Board John Hinckley has described a "flow-coat" system that GM used, whereby parts were painted while hung on hooks or pins, or, in the case of smaller parts, they were thrown together in wire baskets. In the latter case, it would have been easy for one part to shield another part, resulting in no paint coverage in the shadow of another part in the basket. John described the flow-coat system as a paint booth with numerous spray heads that showered the parts with liquid paint, with the excess paint collected under grates in the floor, and then recirculated back into the paint supply reservoir. John also noted that the flow-coat process was commonly referred to as dip-painted, since the results appeared the same.

In general, I have not been able to easily recreate the look of GM-painted brackets using a rattle can. But one way I've figured out how to paint various bumper brackets and achieve the desired GM-look, complete with paint goobers, is via dip-painting. For my longer bumper brackets, I fabricated a long paint reservoir using two plastic trays that were designed to hold compound for taping sheetrock seams. These trays are about 4 inches wide, 3 inches deep, and 14 inches long. After cutting off one end of each, the cut ends can be epoxied together to create a paint tray that is 28" long, which is longer than any C2 bumper bracket. My paint of choice is oil-based, Rustoleum Professional, semi-gloss black, which can be purchased at Lowes by the quart. If you're dealing with clean, well-prepped parts, you don't need to use a primer with this paint. The tricky part is to get the paint viscosity just right for dipping. Out of the can, the paint is too viscous. When parts are dipped into the unthinned paint, the puddles and runs are too numerous and too thick compared to what is seen on original GM parts. It's a case of surface tension winning out over gravity. Also, webs of paint can form over holes. On the other hand, If the paint is thinned too much, the final paint layer is too thin, and sharp exterior corners end up with virtually no paint. If the paint is on the thin side, you

can also dip once, let it dry for a day, and then re-dip to get the desired thickness.


After some trial and error, I wound up using a ratio of around 2.5 parts paint to 1 part thinner. With that amount of thinning you typically wind up with a single bead or drip of dried paint on the lowest point of the part when it's hung to dry. If the drip looks too big, you can gently touch it with a toothpick while the paint is still wet, which pulls away some paint and makes the drip smaller. If you're lucky, you can wind up with a popped paint blister or a dried paint puddle in an internal corner of the part and those look particularly authentic. Fortunately, with the required thinning, it only takes 1 quart of paint plus 13 oz of thinner in an appropriately sized container to dip smallish parts like sway bar brackets, several of the small bumper brackets, steering shock brackets, etc.

Now I'm sure that it's possible to get similar results using a rattle car by getting the part very wet with paint. But I find it harder to hang parts and get access to spray all sides. And it's messier with over-spray, and dealing with the wind if spraying outdoors. I doubt anyone is going to be dip-painting their radiator core support, but many chassis parts that have reasonably small dimensions can easily be done by dipping.

Chapter Meeting Location


The location for Chapter meetings is at St. Peter's Episcopal Church located at 6013 Lawton Avenue, Oakland, CA 94618.


