Chairman Sharyl Ingham welcomed everyone to the August meeting at 7:00 pm via Zoom. It was another well attended virtual meeting including some Southern California guests. As usual, Sharyl asked the attendees to introduce themselves, stating their name, the city where they live, and the year(s) of their Corvette(s). The question of the evening was: Have you voted for our Regional Director yet? Most of us replied "not yet," noting that we have until the end of October to vote for Mike Ingham. Even though he is running unopposed Sharyl feels it is important for all members to cast their vote!

<u>Secretary Report</u>: Sandy Houck
The minutes of the August meeting were approved by the NCC Board via e-mail as submitted by Sandy Houck. Sharyl thanked Sandy for doing an excellent job being the Chapter's secretary.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: John Tidwell John reported that there has been no activity during the last month.

Membership: Sharyl Ingham

Sharyl mentioned that there were 2 new NCRS members that joined within our Region in September. NCC's membership is holding at 103 members. We are down one member because the member did not renew his NCRS membership so Sharyl explained that the NCRS By-laws clearly state that in order to be a Chapter member, you must be an active national NCRS member in good standing.

In Marci's absence, the September Vettectera was an Ingham collaborative effort. Sharyl thanked John and Sophie Tidwell for their article about what is in their Go-Bag for emergencies. The timing of this is more important than ever now with fires burning everywhere. Be READY. And here is another thought that Jim Lockwood passed along: "If you will never see your home again what would you want and need to have with you?"

Sharyl asked Wayne Yurtin to share his family's evacuation. He reiterated how suddenly the fire threat happened. He had about an hour and half to decide what to take. They did pack the car with their important papers and prepared to evacuate but luckily, the fire did not reach them.

<u>Webmaster</u>: Chris Moore Chris was absent.

<u>Chapter Top Flight Award (CTFA)</u>: Jeff Blakeslee

Jeff reported there was no activity during the month. Jeff continues to stress that technical articles are important.

NCRS President & Region IX Director: Mike Ingham

Mike reported there has been no recent noteworthy activity at the National level. The Driveline has election information and candidate statements. Regions 7 and 8 have competitive elections. He mentioned that voting should not be taken lightly.

Old Business:

John Tidwell, as National CFO, told the members that he recently had an interesting conversation with a member from Southern California. Jane Hall is 92 years old and still has a black '57 Corvette that she purchased in 1958 and has been a happy and long-time NCRS member. Sharyl asked Jerry Louer, the SCC's Membership Chairman, if Jane is a SCC member? If not, then Sharyl suggested that

SCC should make her an honorary member because of her age and dedication to NCRS.

New Business:

Sharyl mentioned that she is working with her contact person from Conference Direct on the National Convention in Palm Springs. She says that volunteers will be needed more than ever, and it will be here before we know it.

Sharyl congratulated Ed Vignone for distributing the SCC Bonding Strip newsletter digitally. She went on to mention how cost-effective and efficient this is for the Chapter.

Ken and Marci Albers described their loss from the LNU Complex Fire. It burned their house, garages, shop, 16 cars, and collections. Ken said that at 9:30 pm they saw an orange glow near Lake Berryessa, which was unexpected since the area burned previously. At 2:00 am they got a call from PG&E saying that service would be out. He then saw that fire was just down the hill from them. He went outside to alert neighbors and talked to a Fire Chief who said to get out now! They left with only their two dogs, one car, and one pickup. In Solano County the fire destroyed 250 homes, and on their street burned 9 out of 23 homes. So far, their insurance carriers have been good. Haggerty will pay full value for the cars, and they now are in a rental home in Vacaville. Ken is trying to determine if he can salvage any parts, including 1930s vintage car bodies, fenders, and cast-iron blocks and heads. Their '61 Corvette was mostly saved because it was in the body shop, but interior items were at the house. They would like to rebuild, but currently are dealing with FEMA and hazardous waste cleanup, all of which will take time. They remain amazed at the destruction, and speed and heat of the fire. On the positive side, Marci is excited; she has purchased via eBay a 2007 Ron Fellow Z06 to replace the one that burned. They expressed thanks to the NCC members for their help. Oh, you may have seen the Albers' interviews after the fire on FOX News, CBS Channel 13, and the SF Chronicle.

Sharyl asked Gary Hiltunen, a volunteer fire fighter, for his suggestions. Unfortunately, the Albers' story is not unusual. Gary quickly surmised his observations and noted that people don't know the difference between evacuation and moving. He then went on and suggested having two backpacks; one with important papers and the other with a laptop, medicines, and personal items. The backpacks

should be located between your bedroom and the front door so that you can grab and go within three minutes.

Show and Tell:

Mike asked Joe Lucia to further explain the valves that he showed last month. Three sizes were used in aluminum heads from 1967 to early 1969. The 1.88-inch is the most common, the 1.72 were the early ones, and the 1.84 is the rarest.

Mike showed an antique 1-quart glass bottle used to dispense motor oil that was pumped from a lubester. This completes his garage art (Sharyl hopes).

Adjournment:

As always before adjourning the meeting, she had a list of reminders:

Take care of ourselves by getting a flu shot. Cast your vote!

The next Zoom meeting will be October 13th. If you know of anyone who wants to join, please let Sharyl know or just send them the link when the time comes.

Practice the 3W's:

Wear your mask covering your nose & mouth, Wash your hands often, Watch your physical distance.

The meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm.

Chapter Meeting Location


The location for Chapter meetings is at St. Peter's Episcopal Church located at 6013 Lawton Avenue, Oakland, CA 94618.

Rivet Tools Available for Loan

I have two rivet tools available to loan out. This first tool is primarily intended for installing the rebound straps on C1's.



I mentioned during the August NCC meeting on Zoom that I had purchased a tool to install the two rivets that attach the grounding strap for the air cleaner base to the front of the vertical ignition shield on Sharyl's `69. Now that those two rivets are installed, the rivet tool has taken up residence in my toolbox.




