NCRS is seeking a new National Road Tour Leader because Scott and Kay Sinclair have resigned as co-leaders after ten years of service. Any interest out there?

Mike expressed appreciation to George Campbell, who was a longtime NCRS and founding NW Chapter member who also started the International Registry of Corvettes. George left a nice bequest to NCRS.

Old Business:

Sharyl noted that there was a "Cars 'n Coffee" on Solano Avenue in Albany on October 25th. It is held every month on the 4th Sunday. There is also one called "Second Sundays at the Shipyard" hosted by the USS Hornet

November 8th. All donations go to the USS Hornet as a thank you for letting the auto club use their space. This might be a good reason to venture to Alameda and make a donation.

New Business:

NCC Membership Dues: Sharyl mentioned that many clubs have waived dues for 2021 so she suggested that NCC consider doing the same. After much discussion, Wayne Yurtin made a motion that the NCC dues be made optional for the year 2021. Motion was approved.

Spring Meet: We are going forward with plans to have our Spring Meet April 16th -17th in Suisun City. Sharyl emphasized the need for JUDGES. We already have four cars in the cue to be judged that are carried over from our cancelled 2020 Spring and Fall Meets. It isn't a surprise but being on the West Coast there is always a smaller turnout so Sharyl and Mike said that we will have to work a bit harder recruiting sponsors and participants. As Sharyl put it, this is not nirvana and there will be some complaints but remember, if you have a complaint, have a solution to offer.

- Individuals who do not itemize deductions on their tax return are allowed to deduct up to \$300 in addition to their standard deduction on their 2020 Tax Return.
- Individuals who itemize deductions can deduct cash gifts of up to 100% of their AGI for 2020 rather than the 60% limit which applied previously. The extent to which this may benefit an individual depends on that individual's particular financial situation and desire.






