#### January 12, 2021 NCC Meeting Minutes

Sharyl prefaced the meeting by saying she was delighted to see so many and then asked the

attendees to introduce themselves, stating their name, the city where they live, and the year(s) of their Corvette(s). Sharyl's question of the evening was: Is there anything new in your garage? Surprisingly there were no new C8's mentioned, and it turns out that many are true vehicle enthusiasts.

There were 28 attendees: including members from Alaska, Kansas, Nevada, South Lake Tahoe, and Southern California.

<u>Secretary Report</u>: Sandy Houck The minutes of the December meeting were approved by the NCC Board via e-mail as submitted by Sandy Houck.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: John Tidwell Sharyl asked John to give his report and then she told the members that John will talk about the revisions of Judging Manuals as well because of his knowledge of the process.

John reported that he met his goal for the Chapter to break even.

John then reported that there are five Judging Manuals: 53-55, 56-57, 63-64, 75-76, and 90-91 that are being revised. John explained the revision process. The CTFA program was cancelled in 2020. Jeff did say that all the requirements the Chapter completed in 2020's first quarter are grandfathered in for 2021. The NCRS Board will discuss the CTFA Program for 2021 on January 22<sup>nd</sup> at their meeting.

Ed and Barbara Vignone said that SCC is expecting to go ahead with their Spring Meet scheduled for March 5-6. There will be virus protection instructions and equipment.

Sharyl read a letter from the Southern California Chapter to their members announcing their 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in September and that events will be planned. Included in this letter was a Commemorative Coin in appreciation to the members for their ongoing support.

#### Adjournment:

Sharyl announced that she is willing to send cotton masks that she has sewn throughout the 10 months to any interested members.

Again, Sharyl stressed the importance to keep practicing the 3 W's: Wear your mask covering your nose and mouth, Wash your hands often, and Watch your physical distance.

She then thanked everyone for joining and apologized for the length of the meeting, explaining that at the January meeting there is always a lot of business to handle.

We will continue with Zoom meetings for as long as necessary.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40 pm.



#### C-1 Fuel Filters for Carbureted Corvettes By Gary Hiltunen

A fuel system is comprised of many parts from the fuel tank to the carburetor(s)/FI unit. One of those parts on carbureted cars is the fuel filter unit. On C-1s this part had a die-cast alloy cover with a glass sediment bowl held together with a wire bale and tightening screw.

In this assembly, the fuel filter is identified in the Chevrolet Parts Catalogs by the nouns "strainer" or "element".

The fuel filter used on the '53 through '57 Corvettes was an AC-109-A, part #854273, as documented in the '53 – `54 parts book, Group 3.890 (Fig. 1).





And in the 1957 Chevrolet Parts and Accessories Catalog, Group 3.890 (Fig. 2).

The AC-109-A strainer is a unique-looking design with what appear to be laminated sintered bronze discs held together with two crimped studs (Fig. 3).

Sintered Metal is a solid product made by pressing metal powder into a coherent mass without heating the metal to its melting point. Sintered metals can be made from aluminum, copper, bronze, nickel, brass, steel, stainless steel, and titanium.

Effective on 8-1-57, the AC-109-A was discontinued and replaced with AC-GF-124, part # 854347 (Fig. 4).

The AC-GF-124 was also a sintered bronze filter, brownish in color with a rounded end. For the remaining C-1s, this was the OEM filter for carbureted cars. There were other filters available looking very similar to the AC filters. One of those is a filter by Fram, identified as CG3, which could be used to replace the AC GF-124. A comparison of the AC and Fram filters is shown in Figure 7. Note the lighter color of the Fram filter, which might be due to using a different (sintered metal) formula.

The GF-124 filter is still a current part and is listed as a service replacement for '53 to '62 Corvettes. However, it is now a paper element (Fig. 8).

For everyday use, the paper element is just fine. Even though it is not era correct, it does a better job of filtering. The sintered element filters down to 40 microns, while the paper element filters down to 10 microns.




