Central California Spring Meet: Ron Bartow is planning on using the SCC experience as guidance for their upcoming Spring Meet in Nipomo. Ron mentioned that they are expecting four or five cars.

Suisun City Spring Meet Update: Sharyl and Mike described that all activities: judging school, judging awards, lunch, and raffle will be held outside. Currently more judges are needed. Three cars are signed up so far. Only Ribbons will be handed out. If you are a Judge or Tabulator and want a certificate, please let Sharyl know and she will mail one to you. We will try to set the raffle items up in the Conference room for viewing and on Saturday afternoon, the drawing will be outdoors.

Joe Lucia showed a special and rare NOS negative battery terminal bolt. It was only used from late '69 to early '70. It is unusual because it is a 5/16"-18 thread, whereas the positive side is a 3/8" thread. Joe described that in late '69 GM was the first manufacturer to start using side terminal batteries and Corvette was the first car they used them in. They switched to the same size threads in '70. This led to a wonderful and insightful discussion, Thank you Joe!

### Adjournment:

Sharyl thanked everyone for joining the meeting and again mentioned, even though people are getting vaccinated, it is still important to practice the 3 W's: Wear a mask, Wash your hands, Watch your distance.

### WCFB Carburetor Stand

From the first time I saw the carburetor stand in the WCFB manual, I wanted one but never saw one listed anywhere. I have had my carburetor sitting on the bench more times than I wish to consider. It was always a balancing act. That was until I created my own carburetor stand. Also, if you are working just on the base, you can turn it upside down and work on that part too.

Take a sheet of whatever composite material you have available. Then use four fully threaded bolts (5/16 -18) about 3" long and 12

nuts to create your own. You will wonder why you did not build one sooner.






