The meeting started with a moment of silence honoring and remembering our dear friend and long-time member Linda Hiltunen, who

recently passed losing her battle with cancer, along with the many other friends and neighbors that are no longer with us due to the global pandemic.

Sharyl reminded the members to continue to practice the 3W's. As much as WE all would like to think we are out of the woods, it continues to be our responsibility to mask up so we can move on.

As usual, Sharyl asked the attendees to introduce themselves, stating their name, the city where they live, the year(s) of their Corvette(s) and to answer the question: If you are going to the Suisun City Meet, will you be staying overnight?

Chapter Top-Flight Award (CTFA): Jeff Blakeslee

No activity to report but will continue to keep records of the Chapter's activities as though the CTFA program is active.

NCRS President & Region IX Director: Mike Ingham

The last Board Zoom meeting minutes were published in the Vettecetera. Mike reported that the Board will meet in-person on Friday afternoon at the Arizona Regional for the first time since February of last year. All members are invited to attend. When Mike was asked about people connecting via Zoom, Mike kindly responded that he has enough to do without having to figure out how to make that work. So, at the present time no hybrid meeting is available.

Old Business:

The Central California Chapter Spring Meet was held in Nipomo. Mike Ingham, Wayne Yurtin, and Dana Richard attended the meet and said it was a nice venue. Four cars '54, '67, '95 ZR1, and 2000 were Flight Judged, and there was tremendous selection of Sportsman cars on display.

Sharyl mentioned that she received the Matching Fund checks and that she sent them out to the Meals on Wheels facilities in the four counties we donate to.

New Business:

First thing Sharyl brought up was Sponsorship for the National Convention, mentioning that Glorie McNay's letter of invitation to Sponsor the Judge's and Tabulator's Meals were sent out last week.

Sharyl reminded the members that if they have a business card they want included in the Convention Program to not mention NCRS on the card.

Sharyl made a motion that NCC donate \$100 to the National Convention. There was a second to Sharyl's initial motion and it was unanimously approved. Sharyl explained that she was going to put out an invitation on the NCRS discussion board for other Chapters to accept her challenge and donate to the National Convention as well.

Suisun City Spring Meet:

Sharyl announced that this is a sanctioned NCRS event, and everybody needs to register. She went on to say that members have graciously volunteered to help wherever needed and thus far this is the listing:

Beth Bartow will serve coffee, and Sophie Tidwell will hand out donuts Saturday morning. Sandy Houck will provide water and lemonade during the day. Sophie will help to serve lunches.

Glorie will set up the raffle items inside in the conference room at the Hampton Inn as before. Take a good look and buy plenty of tickets. She doesn't make change.

Bob Grauer will conduct a Judging School Friday from 5:00-6:00 pm in the conference room.

Sharyl has made a 6:30 pm dinner reservation at the Cast Iron Grill and Bar. The seating will be 6 tables of 4 and it will be outdoors so dress accordingly.

There will be three cars to judge: two '63's; and one '66; as well as seven Sportsman entries. Everyone will have to sign the NCRS Hold Harmless Agreement on COVID-19 upon attending.

Show and Tell:

Joe LeMay showed a hat keeper available for \$14.95. It works to keep his hat from flying out of the car when he drives his C1 without the top.

We discussed getting back to in-person meetings at the church in Oakland when it seems comfortable doing so. We would like to hold "hybrid meetings" to include Zoom participants. Need to work out the details. Sandy Houck volunteered to look into the possibility of having hybrid meetings. More to follow.

Dave Houlihan said that he will be going to the Nebraska Chapter Meet on April 24th. It will be broadcast live on the Chapter's Facebook page.

Ken Albers' friend who wants to take his car to the Convention for Concours judging talked with Dave Brigham asking whether the car needs to be judged prior to going to the Convention and the answer is no previous judging is required.

Rick Gower asked about signups for the National Convention. Mike said that so far there are about 150 registrants and 60 cars, and he expects more during the next two months.

Wayne asked for suggestions about removing scratches in glass. Glorie said to use wet fabric softener sheets and then polish.

Jeff commented that a nice '63 fuelie was sold at a Mecum auction for \$247,000.

Rick Gower noted that the Cunningham race car #1 is coming up for auction.

Finally, there were discussions asking about how C8's are selling, what is happening with the upcoming judging manuals, the importance of having some expertise when inspecting cars for originality for potential buyers from other

areas, and how to encourage people to join NCRS.

Gary Hiltunen has asked in lieu of flowers to please donate to the lafoodbank in Linda Hiltunen's memory.

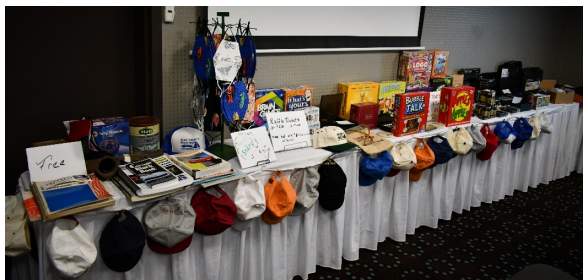
On Friday, Bob Grauer led a judging school on Window Glass.

Free Parts – C2/C3

First photo is of two upper A-arms for 63-82. No pitting, only light surface rust. One A-arm has the original pivot shaft and bushings (not useable). The other has the original, riveted ball joint (not usable). The A-arms can be restored to like new condition with bead blasting or sanding and a new paint job or used as cores in an exchange.



The second photo is of a 64-77 lower A-arm, that will also service 78-82. It has the original, pivot shaft, the original (not useable) bushings and the original (not useable) riveted ball joint. There is no pitting on the A-arm, just light surface rust. A-arm can be restored to like new condition with bead blasting or sanding and a new paint job or used as a core in an exchange.

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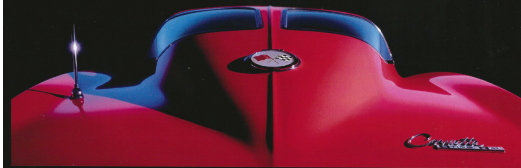
