GM 9418970 Screw Assemblies; Non-Identical Twins By Gary Beaupre

There is little information on the Corvette Forum or on the Technical Discussion Board (TDB) archives about "screw assemblies", G 9418970. A search of "9418970" in the TDE

(TDB) archives about "screw assemblies", GM 9418970. A search of "9418970" in the TDB archives yields one thread from 2007. The Corvette Forum also has a single thread. I thought others might be interested in what I recently learned about these screws. GM 9418970 is described as a "SCREW ASM" in the AIMs. The "ASM" term means an assembly, which in the case of screws typically means there is a captive washer of some sort. For 64-67, that part number appears on 3 pages in the AIMs, with a total quantity of 15 screw assemblies per car. There are 4 such screws associated with the attachment of the glove box door lower bracket to the hinge pillar brace; 3 that secure the glove box hinge to the previously mentioned bracket; 4 that secure the metal channels that hold the rear window runs to the door jams; and 4 that secure the inside door pull levers to the inner door surfaces.

On my '66, eleven of the GM 9418970 screw assemblies associated with the glove box and the rear window runs appear identical. Those screws are black phosphate, Phillips pan-head, with a captured flat washer which is also black phosphate. The threads are 1/4-20x1/2". The screw head OD is 0.480" and the flat washer OD is 0.50". Those specifications match what appears in the '66 JG for the rear door jam location. Those screws associated with the

glove box door and bracket are not described in the `66 JG.

On my '66, the remaining qty=4 of GM 9418970 associated with the two inside door opening mechanisms are somewhat different. Those screws are 1/4-20x1/2", Phillips panhead, with captured flat washers, but the screws and flat washers are zinc plated, and the flat washer has an OD of 0.75". Of course, those 4 screws are not visible for judging, so there is no description of them in the JG. I've seen multiple photos that show these screws with washers noticeably larger than the screw heads, so I believe the screws on my car are original, and that other cars have the same zinc plated screws, with 0.75" OD washers.

The figure below shows the window run and glove box version of this screw on the left, and the door pull lever version of the screw on the right. Note that the door pull screw has body color on it, Rally Red in the case of my car. Is it possible that the GM engineering drawing for this screw assembly allows for different finishes (black phosphate vs zinc) and different ODs (0.5" vs 0.75") for the captive washer? I think that would be unusual, but I can't say it's impossible.



My interest in the 9418970 screw assemblies arose because the 64-67 AIMs show the use of an additional, loose, flat washer under the screw assemblies securing the rear window run channels at the door jam. Of course, that would mean there would be two flat washers per screw, since the screw assembly already has one captured flat washer. But the '66 JG specifically states that multiple washers are a justification for a deduction. This is an example of a situation where those of us who sometimes overly rely on the AIM to guide our restoration are very likely to get a deduction for a non-factory typical configuration. Tip for Installing the Rear Metal Channel for the Side Window Glass in a C2 Coupe

I just finished installing the main, side window glass in the passenger's door of my '66 coupe. I wanted to thank two people for suggesting a simple, but ever so helpful tip that made the installation process so much easier. The tip has to do with the rear metal channel that captures the lower end of the rear vertical fuzzy run. The channel in question is shown in the next photo, with the top end at the upper left and the bottom end at the lower right. For a coupe, that channel is GM 3840595 for the driver's side, and GM 3840596 for the passenger's side. Those channels are secured to the rear door jam by black phosphate Phillips pan-head screws at the top and the bottom.



A close-up of the upper end is shown in the next photo. The metal-reinforced fuzzy run inserts into the side facing down.



Credit for the following tip goes to user jrm5657 (Jim Messmer) on the Corvette Forum and to another person who provided text and photos (as a PDF, I believe, which I have since misplaced or discarded) showing the critical modification. Maybe that 2nd person will read this posting and identify themself. In any case, the extremely helpful tip is to extend the elongated hole near the top of the rear metal

channel so that the hole is converted into a slot with an open end at the top. The modified part is shown in this next photo.



Doing that simple modification makes it possible to slide the channel up behind the rear vertical fuzzy run so that the slot slips around the waist of the "bubble" clip in the fuzzy run. Sliding up the channel into place avoids the need to snap that bubble clip into the original hole in the metal channel. Those bubble clips can be very difficult to snap into their holes, and given where that bubble clip is located makes it incredibly difficult to snap that particular clip into the unmodified hole.
