Our local key expert Gary Beaupre informed him that the key for the doors and trunk lock is of a configuration that wasn't used until later model years. So Mike will be getting a complete set of correct keys and locks from Joe Calcagno, Rare Corvettes.

Joe LeMay showed a tool used to change out driveshaft U-joints. But it doesn't work on his C1, may be okay for a C2.

Dave Houlihan showed a harmonic balancer where the press-fit slip ring has slipped. So, the timing marks are in the wrong location.

Bob Kennard showed a kick down rod from his '61 Powerglide transmission that he broke. He has been looking for a replacement for a long time.

What crazy weather all over the country! Instead of covering cars the last two days, I used the car covers to cover our plants. orchids and succulents, to protect them from frost. Not common here this time of year. Oh well; let's think about spring and summer travel. I have a couple of suggestions. When packing for a road trip or tour, create more room and keep those dress up clothes or any you won't need on the road in top condition and make room in your luggage compartment. Lay those clothing items flat and neat on the floor of the luggage space and then cover them with a dollar store tri-fold cardboard display board. Your luggage will lay on top and the clothes will not be disturbed in the loading and unloading. This trick will work in all Corvettes prior to the C-8. Another item I have found beneficial to have when traveling is a collapsible cane just in a case. We hope you never need it but trips or walking on uneven pavement happen. On uneven ground a tripod which the use of a cane offers provides great stability. ALSO, if placed near the opening it provides an extension to reach inaccessible items.
