## This `n That

Happy April! Well April 1<sup>st</sup> we celebrate fools. I am the fool. I never anticipated an NCRS presidential election to be so shocking. The election was totally legal as the Bylaws stand. This summer the Board will meet again, and Regional Representatives will have a chance to present the wishes of their constituents. It is my hope (the fool again) that the membership will request amendments to the Bylaws requiring notice of candidates and the presence of candidates when a previously announced election is to take place. This would give the membership and the Board the opportunity to study the platform, to examine the qualifications and plan to be present or attend virtually. I doubt

that any aspiring candidate would take exception to such an amendment to the bylaws. Let's bring civility to our elections.

#### 1960 Tank Suction Fuel Leak The Problem

We purchased our 1960 Corvette in 1995 and have enjoyed top-down drives along Turnagain Arm with our vintage car friends on severeclear summer days here in Anchorage, Alaska. On the designated Scenic Seward Highway there is a pullout about ten miles south of our home in Anchorage at Beluga Point that can accommodate about forty vehicles. It is a beautiful drive and a great chance to get a good engine and drivetrain warm-up run in and there are enough curves to make it a fun drive as well. It is also a great spot to chat it up with the Harley riders and the tourists in their motor homes. They all love our classic Corvettes. This is also a good spot to watch the Beluga whales rolling in Cook Inlet while they chase Coho and Sockeye salmon on the incoming tide on their way to spawning grounds up Bird Creek and Twentymile River. While we did love the drives, the one thing we did not enjoy was the smell of unburned gasoline fumes. The fumes were detectable even with the top down when idling or underway in a cross wind. A scarf or jacket pulled out of the trunk also wreaked of gasoline fumes. The odor of gasoline fumes would permeate the whole garage area for three days after a drive (see Photo #1).




#### The Repair

The smell seemed to originate behind the seats in the fuel tank area rather than from the engine compartment. It is always a good idea to disconnect the battery when working on the fuel system to eliminate the possibility of an errant spark near raw fuel (see Photo #2).



The Assembly Instruction Manual shows a schematic of the tank, sending unit assembly, and tank vent line (see Photo #3).



Accessing the top of the fuel tank requires opening the soft top deck lid behind the seats, lifting the convertible top, and pushing the lower end forward, and removing the fuel tank cover (see Photo #4).



A search for the source of these gasoline fumes indicated a fuel leak at the sending-unitassembly/fuel-line-connection on the top side of the fuel tank (see Photo #5).



Photo #6 shows the fuel line disconnected from the sending unit assembly.




Photo 7 shows the tubing fitting threaded connection products required to make the repairs. The Teflon tape and pipe joint compound must be rated for hydrocarbon service or gasoline will dissolve them (speaking from personal experience). Each of these products was tried individually on the brass flare fitting threads but failed to stop the leak.



The fuel was not leaking through the threads, but under them, between the inside diameter of the flare fitting nut and the outside diameter of the tubing. At this point the correct method to continue the repair would have been to cut and re-flare the fuel line, or replace the flare fitting, flare nut, and this segment of the fuel line. Wanting to get back on the road while good weather was available without having to order and wait for new parts, a repair was implemented with the available parts on hand. Also known as "jury rigging." Wrapping Teflon tape up against the back of the flare to form a gasket for the flare nut leading edge could prevent fuel from getting under the nut and leaking by the nut inside-diameter onto the tank (see Photo #8).



The fitted-up connection is shown in Photo #9 and the end result looks like a professional repair.



A test of the repair held! No more gasoline fume odors! The car has over a thousand miles on it since the repair and still holding strong.

#### The Back Story

After running out of gas twice when the fuel gauge indicated half full, the original fuel sending unit was replaced with an aftermarket unit years ago to improve the fuel gauge accuracy. The fuel level accuracy did not improve with the replacement. The accuracy problem pertained to fuel system electrical grounding issues. An excellent article in the Winter 2001 Corvette Restorer by Dan Materazzi entitled "Checking the Fuel Level System on a 1955 to 1962 Corvette" provides instructions on how to functionally check out the electrical grounds and operation of the various fuel system components. These include the gas gauge, the wiring between the gauge and the gas tank sending unit, the gas tank sending unit, the gas tank and twelve-volt system grounds. As a point of reference, the Restorer article by Dan Materazzi describes a functional test of sending unit: "With the sending unit out of the car, measure the resistance through its range of travel between the terminal and the case of the sender. This should vary between zero ohms at empty to 32 ohms at full, in a smooth fashion as the float is moved through it range of travel." Once the grounding issues were corrected, the fuel gauge accuracy improved.

The reason the aftermarket fuel sending unit was so hard to seal was due to a design change in the sending unit connection seating surface. The seating surface on the aftermarket unit is flat so only the tip of the flare makes contact with the seat. I could not get a good camera angle on this surface without removing the sending unit from the tank which I did not want to do at this time. The OEM sending unit shown in Photos #10 and #11 has a tapered seating surface in the fuel line connection that makes contact with the entire inner surface of the flared tubing, not just the tip, and has a much better chance of making a leak proof seal.



The first five years of Corvette ownership was a steep learning curve on replacement parts houses. I ordered choke tubes (from the carburetor choke to the passenger side exhaust manifold) from five different parts houses before I found one with the correct compound bends that fit perfectly. The cost of the freight to Alaska is almost always more than the part. I talked to C1 owners at the 2002 Monterey National Convention and they recommended Paragon for OEM replacement parts. I have been very happy with their products.
