Just a heads up for those that will attend our June Zoom meeting, this will be the main topic we need to talk about to get some sort of plan in place and hopefully a committee to help execute. Speaking of which, the Hampton Inn will not confirm our chosen dates of April 14-15, 2023, for NCC's annual Spring Meet in Suisun City. Talk about frustration, it seems my calls are being screened where I cannot talk with the owner to get us on the calendar. Any thoughts? Bring your ideas to the meeting.

Note: There are no NCC Meeting minutes for May because we did not have a meeting. But there are minutes below from the NCRS Board that may be of interest to you.

May 3, 2022 NCRS Board Meeting Minutes

NCRS Board of Directors Meeting was called to order at 11:05 AM EDT.

Present were Shannon Urton, John Ballard, Rick Coker, Mike Ingham, Bob Johansen, Patricia Kropac, Harry Ledgerwood, Ralph Ridge, Mark Tulley, Larry Colvin, John Tidwell Kristy Heath (ConferenceDirect), Kristen Holmes (ConferenceDirect)

- 1. Presentation and Approval of Executive Board Meeting Minutes from April 4, 2022 Larry Colvin.
 - a. Ralph Ridge moved, and Harry Ledgerwood seconded, to approve the minutes from the Executive Board Meeting of April 4, 2022.
 - i. Discussion: None.
 - ii. Passed: 9 For, None Against.
- Bryce Burklow (National Corvette Museum) Meeting Review – Shannon Urton.
 - a. Shannon met with Bryce Burklow via Zoom on April 14, 2022 regarding holding the 2024 NCRS National Convention at the National Corvette Museum (NCM) facility in Bowling Green, KY.
 - Moving display cars out of the Museum to make space for NCRS cars is not feasible.
 - NCM offered the indoor space where the NCM performs Museum deliveries.
 - Museum deliveries would be suspended during the National Convention.
 - ii. NCRS would have to pay 50% of the total fees new Corvette owners would have paid for the NCM delivery option during that period.
 - This would partially offset the NCM revenue loss of \$1,000 per car delivered for the entire week of the NCRS Convention.
 - Museum deliveries occur 7-days per week.
 - d. NCM offered other outside areas on NCM grounds free of charge.

- These would be exposed to the weather and would require tents.
- e. Tenting for outside spaces would have to be supplied by a local Bowling Green company.
 - i. Proposed cost of \$63,200 for one unlit, non-air-conditioned large tent.
 - Additional cost would be incurred for lighting and air conditioning.
 - iii. Four to five tents, at a cost of \$252,800 to \$316,000 would be needed, plus lighting and air conditioning.
 - 1. These costs are clearly prohibitive.
- f. Comment was made that it would have been nice to have this information earlier so alternative plans could have been more easily made.
- g. Strong consensus of the Board that the NCM is not a viable location option for the 2024 National Convention.

3. 2024 National Convention Options – Shannon Urton.

- a. Current options:
 - i. Hampton Roads, Virginia August 4th through 9th.
 - ii. Mohegan Sun (Groton), Connecticut – July 14th through 19th.
- b. Analysis (via side-by-side spreadsheet):
 - i. Hampton Roads option is more cost-effective.
 - Some corrections were made to the spreadsheet which increased the cost advantage.
 - ii. Mohegan Sun rooms are over \$200, which typically has been the ceiling for past events.
 - iii. Hampton Roads has more hotel options, some of which are lower cost.
 - iv. Mohegan Sun local area has fewer attractions.
- c. General consensus that Hampton Roads is the preferable option.
- Need to devise a plan for judges' breakfasts when judges are staying at different hotels.

- e. Shannon Urton moved, and Mark Tulley seconded, to select Hampton Roads, Virginia as the site of the 2024 NCRS National Convention on August 4th through August 9th, 2024.
 - i. Discussion: None.
 - ii. Passed: 9 For, None Against.
- f. Need to get the necessary contracts to John Tidwell as soon as possible.

4. National Convention Options for West in 2025 – Shannon Urton.

- a. Kristy Heath suggested:
 - i. Reno/Tahoe, NV.
 - ii. Washington State.
 - iii. Las Vegas, NV.
- b. Discussion about potentially moving the National Convention out of July.
 - National Conventions do not attract as many vacationing families as in previous years.
 - Only 4 children currently registered for 2022 event in Mobile, AL.
 - Kristy will look at both July and August for dates in the future.
- c. Mark Tulley noted that there are only 2 Regionals currently scheduled in advance of the 2024 National Convention.
 - i. Status of the Florida Regional in 2024 is currently unknown.
 - ii. Finalizing the 2024 Hampton Roads, VA National Convention site decision will help.
- d. Shannon Urton noted that the 2024 Hampton Roads location was suggested because it was close to a large Hendrick dealership in Norfolk, VA.
 - i. It is hoped that this location will help foster our relationship with Hendrick.

5. NCRS Regional Events - Mark Tulley.

- Suggestion was made to have more oversight/involvement by the NCRS Board in Chapter Regional event proposals.
 - i. Help prevent Chapters from making financial

mistakes in Regional event planning.

- Suggestion was made to discontinue the \$500 fee paid to NCRS by Chapters for inspection of potential event sites.
 - John Tidwell noted that this would have an insignificant effect on NCRS finances.
- c. Suggestion was made to have food trucks at events.
- d. Including C6's in judging will mean additional judges added to the count for judges' meals.
- e. John Ballard described potential issues with future Florida Regionals.
 - Board needs to be continually involved.

6. National Convention Events – Shannon Urton.

- Harry Ledgerwood asked about the feasibility of using a few fixed sites, geographically separated, to hold repeated Conventions.
 - Difficult to predict future car counts or family attendance.
- b. John Tidwell has done an analysis of previous National Conventions covering the conditions and financial performance of each.
- Patricia Kropac pointed out that Conventions where everything is close do not require the expense of a rental car for attendees.

Shannon Urton moved, and Patricia Kropac seconded, to adjourn the meeting.

Discussion: None.
Passed: 9 For, None Against.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 PM EDT.

Next Board meeting is Tuesday, June 21, 2022, at 11:00 AM EDT via Zoom.
