<u>Chapter Top-Flight Award (CTFA)</u>: Jeff Blakeslee

We discussed holding the in-person November as a Social Event. Pizza and refreshments will be provided. Jeff and Bob will organize it. Bob proposed that we retire from the CTFA program. A motion was made by Wayne Yurtin and seconded by Jeff Blakeslee. Approved unanimously.

One will be a valuable single item and the second the traditional multiple items arranged by Glorie McNay. The raffle revenues will be used to pay for lunches for the judges.

NCRS Region IX Director and Vice-President: Mike Ingham

Mike reported highlights of the national Board meeting on September 28. The revenues on most budget items increased over last year. President Mark Tulley has formed committees to work on needed HR guidelines, membership, social media, and improved youth programs. Wayne Yurtin asked about the lack of activity on NCRS Instagram accounts. Tony Stein said the Board intends to recover control of its social media accounts. Gary discussed postings about warranty issues using silicon brake fluid, which O-rings are incompatible, and when it can be safely used in older cars. Jeff Blakeslee added ASTM details about rubber and silicon compatibility.

Rick mentioned several items: The '78-'79 Judging Manual is being revised; This is last year for publication of the Corvette Black Book; Various postings about the '53 #001 reportedly being found; Vinnie Peters posts pictures of NCRS events; and the YouTube video of the 70-year display at the Monterey Reunion.

restored by Corvette Specialties of Maryland



C3 Mechanical Fuel Pump Ills

Interesting thread on C3 Corvette Forum regarding problems with aftermarket mechanical fuel pumps. Original poster noted they had gone through 3 Carter-style pumps in two years. Another respondent noted their fuel pump had gone bad after less than 750 miles.

Figure 1 is a generic mechanical fuel pump.
Rotation of camshaft lobe moves a pushrod that in-turn activates pump by motion of a lever. Fulcrum of that lever is a pin, and that pin is under a lot of pressure, and is the source of our problem.



From 1955 through early 1966 (correct me) Corvette saw mechanical fuel pumps with "pins" that went thru the pump body. (Figure 2). These pumps sometimes suffered from "walking" pins - I'll make note of that later. Judging Guide for 1966 addresses "early" fuel pumps but is silent on "later" fuel pumps.



In-any-case, 1967 and on, saw a GM pump redesign with an **internal** pin. Figure 3 shows details of this pump. There is no thru pin. This internal pin is held in place by retainers - and those retainers are swaged in place.




Figure 4 shows our problem. This aftermarket pump has no retainer swaged in place. Instead, that pin is "crimped". Lots of pressure on this pin/fulcrum - those lightly "crimped" pins fail (come out) during engine operation.



Figure 5 shows a side-by-side comparison of both production types. I understand these Carter-type pumps are also repackaged as Delphi. If replacing a fuel pump on late C2 or

C3 (up through 1981) - you might want to check construction before installation.



Figure 6 is a current Edelbrock replacement fuel pump. This design has a thru pin - not subject to this "crimped" pin failure. Mid-Year Flight Judging assigns 15 points Originality and 10 points Condition - 25 total to fuel pump. C3 varies with some years 15 total and others 20 points total. This is out of 4500 possible points. Given a "significantly dissimilar" appearance between stock and Edelbrock, as an owner, you should expect a Standard Deduction Guideline #13 Total Deduction.



Those "thru pin" pumps can also have their own issues. Figure 7 depicts a thru pin "walking" out of a pump. No pin, no fulcrum, no gas. Several "fixes" have been devised, from longer pins with clips, to a retainer plate.



Anybody been victim from these problems? (And no, I have not removed mine to check!)
