I arrived late on Friday night, so I missed out on some of the best parts of the event. I asked past president Bob Grauer to summarize his feelings about the events of Friday evening, and here is what he had to say:

"Chris Springer's tech talk was brilliant. He gave everyone his background restoring classic muscle cars and exotics. He talked about Joe Calcagno's 1962 that had been put into storage for 34 (?) years, in a trailer on Joe's property in Soquel, CA.
