Chairman's Message - The Devil is in the Details

For the last few years, I have been on the sidelines of the Corvette restoration game. After restoring two C2 Corvettes in the previous 10 years, it was time for a break. But now that I'm working on my `69, I'm reminded of my love-hate relationship with reproduction parts.

I do love that so many reproduction parts are available for Corvettes. There are times when a reproduction part becomes your only option. However, virtually every problem I have during a restoration has to do with a reproduction part. My latest example is a set of outer side glass window seals I recently purchased from one of the major Corvette parts vendors.

There are two pieces to each outer seal. One piece is the actual rubber and felt seal and the other piece is a stainless-steel molding that

trims the edge of the door. My original outer moldings were in good shape, so I just bought the inner seals. When they arrived and I removed them from the box I was initially pleasantly surprised with the quality. The felt seal was like OEM, and the assembly fit with the OEM outer molding almost perfectly. The ends were trimmed nicely and rounded like the originals.

The outer seals on a C3 are mounted using two screws at each end and five specifically shaped snap in clips that hold the molding and seal to the door behind the glass. The clips snap into oblong holes in the door frame, and they are important because they enable the removal of the outer seal while the glass is still in the car. Removal of the outer seal provides a little extra room so the glass can be removed more easily. In other words, you can remove the screws on the ends and then use a trim pry tool to release the clips and remove the entire seal and molding before the glass is removed. This is where the trouble began.

The clips on the original seals are spring steel, so when they are pressed into place in the mounting holes they rebound and hold the seal and molding in place. Unfortunately, the clips on the reproduction unit were not spring steel, and instead were a soft metal that felt like tin. They looked correct, but when pressed into the mounting holes they just squished and would not lock into place. Of all ten clips, not even one clip would stay in place. Not wanting to wait another two weeks for another set, which may or may not be any better, I decided to mount the moldings with small screws. These screws won't be seen, but it will make it harder to install the side glass with the molding already in place.

This is one of those parts where reproduction is about your only choice. Even if you could find NOS, the rubber would likely be degraded over time from just sitting on the shelf. So, you have to make do the best you can. These are obviously being made overseas, and I would not be surprised if the original units were made with spring steel and then the manufacturer changed that without notice. I read the previous reviews of the product and none of them mentioned this, in fact, there were statements that the product installed easily and "snapped right in". However, the last review was from 2018, so I suspect a production change in the last seven years. I seldom write reviews, but this time I did and unfortunately the vendor has not posted it yet.

It will be interesting to see if they ever do. Once again, the devil is in the details.

Food For Thought



Manuals Available


