Chairman's Message – Plan B

Ten years ago, I would have jumped right into the restoration on my new `69 coupe. I have had the car about eight months now and I have done some mechanical repairs, but I have been making excuses about why I have not pulled the body off and really gotten to it. For a bit, I tried to convince myself the car was so good that maybe mechanical repairs are all that was needed. But I knew I was just kidding myself. There are things you can only do with the body off if you want the car to be reliable and have longevity. As good as the car is, I bought it with the plan of doing a body-off restoration. So, what's holding me back?

I'll admit I have less energy than ten years ago, but (I'm hoping) there are other reasons also. I'm telling myself that along with the loss of energy I have gained wisdom, and I believe this time I was more aware that waiting a year to really get to know the car was a smart first

step in the restoration. Over the last eight months, I really did get to know the car. I drove it weekly and learned what worked and what didn't, and I explored what it would take to get the car where I wanted it. I cataloged and organized the spare parts that came with it and researched the availability of other parts I need. This is my first C3 project, first big block project, and first AC car, so there was a learning curve that was going to take some time.

This has also given me time to plan my attack. The Tuxedo Black paint on the car is in very good shape; I give it an 8 out of 10. The previous owners of the car were Mike and Sharyl Ingham, and a lot of work was completed under their ownership. This included rebuilding the instrument cluster and console instruments, replacing the dash wiring harness and replacing the carpet, so the interior is looking good. The original leather seats are in impressive condition, and I can't bring myself to swap them for reproduction covers.

Since I've owned the car, I have rebuilt the window motors and tracks and installed new felt along with some other interior repairs. So, while the body and interior are not concourse perfect, they are quite nice and feel very real. This is where Plan B comes in; I have decided not to paint the car or fully dissemble the interior. Instead, I will take the body off and set it aside so I can rebuild the chassis and engine. I will of course take the opportunity to rebuild the other mechanicals attached to the body, including the vacuum systems, the fore and aft wiring harness, heater and AC box and fan, head lights and actuators, wiper motor etc. But this time around I'm going to choose originality over perfection whenever I have a serviceable part.

My goal is to end up with a car that can make it to the Duntov award while retaining a true feeling of originality. More importantly, I want to drive this car, not carry it around in a trailer. This car has reminded me of the fun I used to have with my cars before I made them into museum pieces. Given my personality type, it's going to be hard to accept cosmetic imperfections, but I'm going to keep telling myself that "it's only original once". I have a few more weeks to complete a truck project my son and I are working on, then I'm going to get started on the `69 in January.


